Jones enlisted in the US Army on 15 March 1977, completed 12 years as an Artillery Cannon Crewman before a career ending medical condition. He served in Germany, Korea, and the US. This was first such funeral where an apparent tradition in the Army was carried out. At almost the end of the service his name was called out, three times with a brief pause between, and his middle name was included in the last. The apparent purpose, cementing in the mind the name of the deceased soldier.


