CG Members were: John Mark Jenney, Rod Jenney, Bill Bentler, Jack Foster, Chris Fridley, and Marshall Anderson





Presentations (Summary)

27 Oct: The John Paul Jones Education Team spent the day with the eighth-grade classes at Fairview Middle School, Bremerton. The presentation team presenters were; Fred Gilbert, Bob Smalser and the Washington State SAR President Viren Lemmer. Viren started the presentation explaining what the SAR is and talked about the differences between the uniforms the presenters are using. Fred introduced the speakers and talked about some of the causes of the revolution, the start of the revolution with Lexington 19 April, 1775 to the time General Washington departs Valley Forge with a new trained Continental Army. This was followed by Bob Smalser who spoke on the involvement of the Western Pennsylvania frontier militia, the evolution of the long rifle one of General Washington's secret weapons, the PA sharp shooters along with their tactical use as well as the day-to-day life of the frontier farming family. All presenters were in their period attire with a copy of the Declaration of Independence, a newspaper from 1781 with the stamp act stamp and our 250th flag



31 Oct: The Seattle education team along with Ranger Chapter President Tim Doughty presented to the student body (K-8) of the Sky Valley Education Center in Monroe Washington for their 250th Celebration. Over 200 students were present for the event. Neil Vernon presented the "History of the American Flag" as the first speaker of the day. A display table of artifacts with SAR brochures and program literature was available as the students, parents, and teachers made their round of the booths. Andrew Chaffin, Stephen Clayton, and Neil Vernon were all in period Uniform.

The school was presented with a Certificate of Appreciation of Celebrating the 250th Anniversary, a WASSAR Challenge Coin, and a framed copy of the Declaration of Independence.

3 Nov: The JPJ education group taught an hour on the Rev War to five classes of 8th Graders at Fairview Middle School in East Bremerton. 150 or so students. Viren Lemmer, our state president, joined us. His ancestor was a musician, who wore the reverse colors of the Continental Army uniform. Other members were Fred Gilbert,

4 Nov: The Seattle Education team in period clothing attended the Madrona School Veterans Day Assembly of over 400 students (K-8). Prior to the presentation of the Colors, Neil Vernon, with the assistance of students, introduced the flags of each military unit. The presentation of colors was performed by Christopher Clayton, Stephen Clayton, and Richard Seeder.



10 Nov: The John Paul Jones Education Team spent the day with the eighth-grade classes at John Sedwick Middle School, Port Orchard, WA. The presentation team presenters were; Fred Gilbert and Conrad Plyler. Fred introduced the speakers and talked about some of the causes of the revolution, the start of the revolution with Lexington 19 April, 1775 to the time General Washington departs Valley Forge with a new trained Continental Army. This was followed by Conrad Plyler who discussed the militia of the south and why the focus of the revolution moved the resource rich South. All presenters were in their period attire with a copy of the Declaration of Independence, a newspaper from 1781 with the stamp act stamp and our 250th flag.



The John Paul Jones Chapter finished two days of presentations at the Ridgetop Middle School, Silverdale, WA. The first day was 1 Dec and the presenters were: Fred Gilbert, Chapter Education Coordinator and Bob Smalser, Chapter Education Adviser. Fred discussed what lead up to the American Revolution through Valley Forge and General Washington leaving Valley Forge with a well-trained Army. Bob discussed the Western Frontier Militia and Riflemen and how they were General Washington's secret weapon starting with the Siege of Boston. He also discussed what life was like on the frontier and the process of what it took for the German community to immigrate to PA. The second day of presentations was 5 Dec. On the 5th our SAR State President Viren Lemmar joined the team with a full day of presentations. Fred Gilbert discussed the signing of the American Revolution and how it affected not the colonies but all of Europe, Battle of Long Island, Burning of Danbury, CT, Battles of: Long Island, Saratoga and Philadelphia then on to Valley Forge. Bob discussed the militia and how the colonist invented the PA Long Rifle. Viren Lemmar followed and presented the critical responsibility of the Fife and Drummer was the commanders, and how the commanders communicated to the troops on the Battle Field by using the fife and drummer.

Fred Gilbert presented the teachers with a John Paul Jones Chapter challenge coin and President Viren Lemmar presented Ms. Shauna Barnett with a WA State SAR challenge coin and thanking all the teacher for their community support.
